ABOUT THE SHOW

The Iliad is the first great story of the Western tradition – a monument to the glory and futility of war. It tells the story of 40 days in the 10th and final year of the Trojan War. At its heart, it follows a single theme, the fury of Achilles, who is immobilised by pride and honour and never lifts a weapon for 20 of the 24 books. This adaptation brings the story back to its original oral tradition, when it was spoken (sung) over 15 hours.

This adaptation by William Zappa after Homer, has been 7 years in the making. Zappa has researched 17 translations, travelled far and wide, testing the work. Homer came from a tradition of professional guilds of storytelling, the words were meant to be heard. So now with the start originally a commissioned radio drama, the four actors devote themselves to the storytelling with their voice their primary instrument but delivered as if a staged reading with script in hand, moving in and out of the central sand circle.

Each book unfolds like a TV serial, with episodic recaps of the story so far: from Homer's filmic forensic view of the battlefield to the Gods' ultimate lack of care or control over fate. It's an epic tale told with unflinching tenderness and flashes of bleak humour from the Gods.
